



Training VDO Driving Licences in Thailand

- 1. **Vehicle Registration**: Register your vehicle and pay the tax in advance. If your vehicle is older than seven years, it must pass an inspection before paying tax.
- 2. **Driving License**: Always carry your valid driving license and a copy of your vehicle registration with you.
- 3. **Vehicle Modifications**: Inform the DLT office within seven days if you make modifications to your vehicle, such as changing the color.
- 4. **Vehicle Ownership Transfer**: Notify the DLT within 15 days if you transfer ownership of your vehicle.
- 5. Driving without License: It's illegal to drive
- 6. with an unregistred red plate
- 7. without a valid driving license.
- 8. **International License**: Non-Thai citizens can only apply for personal car or motorcycle licenses in Thailand. An international driving license can be obtained with a valid five-year Thai driving license.
- 9. Penalty for driving without a license: Imprisonment of up to 1 month or a fine not exceeding 1000 baht or both
- 10. A five year personal driving licence can be renewed 3 months in advance
- 11. A fINE HAS TO BE PAID IN 7 DAYS
- 12. **WHile drTraffic Laws**: Drive on the left side of the road in Thailand. The far left lane should be used as much as possible, except for overtaking or when there are obstacles.
- 13. **Traffic Signals**: Green means go, yellow means slow down, and red means stop. Always obey traffic signals and give way to pedestrians.
- 14. Flashing Yellow Light: A flashing yellow light means caution; always be extra careful.
- 15. **Road Signals**: Follow traffic police signals, which can be given using hands, arms, or whistles.

- 16. **Lane Changes**: Be aware that traffic police may temporarily rearrange lanes during busy times.
- 17. **Warning Signs**: Learn these warning signs: parallel right exit, give way ahead, school zone, lane ends, T-junction, angled side road, steep incline, railroad crossing, pedestrian crossing, and divided road ends.
- 18. **Restrictive Signs**: Learn these restrictive signs: give way, give way to oncoming traffic, no changing to right lane, speed limit, no parking, no access for cars, no stopping, and pedestrians only.
- 19. **Road Surface Signs**: Full lines mean no overtaking, dashed lines mean overtaking is possible when safe, and a box with diagonal lines means no stopping.
- 20. **Parking Restrictions**: Don't park in restricted areas such as bridges, tunnels, intersections, or near fire hydrants. Also, avoid parking within 10 meters of traffic lights and 15 meters of train tracks.
- 21. **Parking Distance Rules**: Park at least 3 meters away from fire hydrants, 10 meters from traffic lights, and 15 meters from railroad tracks or bus stops.
- 22. **Signaling**: Always signal before starting from a full stop and before turning at an intersection. Signal at least 30 meters in advance when turning.
- 23. **Major vs. Minor Roads**: If a sign says "give way," you're on a minor road and must yield to vehicles on the major road.
- 24. Roundabouts: Drive on the left in roundabouts. Yield to traffic coming from the right.
- 25. **Overtaking Rules**: Don't overtake from the left or in hazardous areas such as narrow roads, steep bridges, or curves unless permitted by signs.
- 26. **Overtaking When Being Overtaken**: If you're being overtaken, stay on the left and don't accelerate.
- 27. **Motorcycle Safety**: Always wear a helmet, check brakes, lights, and tires before riding. Don't ride against traffic.
- 28. **Road Accidents**: In the event of an accident, stop, help anyone who might be hurt, and call the authorities. Provide your name, contact info, and license plate number to others involved.

- 29. Accident Scene: Pull over to the side of the road to let emergency vehicles pass.
- 30. **Driving Under the Influence**: Never drive under the influence of alcohol or drugs. The penalties are severe.
- 31. **Mobile Phone Use**: Don't use your phone while driving.
- 32. Tailgating: Maintain a safe distance from the vehicle in front of you to avoid accidents.
- 33. **Bad Road Conditions**: Slow down in poor road conditions, such as during rain, fog, or roadworks.
- 34. **Driving in Poor Visibility**: Adjust your speed and use lights when visibility is low due to rain, smoke, or fog.
- 35. **Speeding**: Obey speed limits at all times, and reduce speed in busy or hazardous areas.
- 36. Night Driving: Be extra careful when driving at night, and always use lights properly.
- 37. **Overtaking on Bad Roads**: Don't overtake when road conditions are poor or when visibility is compromised.
- 38. **Unsafe Overtaking**: Don't overtake in areas where visibility is limited or when there are restrictive signs.
- 39. **Signal Use**: Always use your turn signal when changing lanes or turning.
- 40. **Honk Use**: Use the horn sparingly, only as a warning, and never use it for long durations.
- 41. **High Beam Use**: Use high beams only when necessary, such as for overtaking or in poorly lit areas.
- 42. **Safe Parking**: Always park where it's safe and legal, and leave the car in neutral if it could block other vehicles.
- 43. **Good Driving Habits**: Stay on the left lane, don't tailgate, use signals, and avoid sudden movements to ensure safety for everyone.
- 44. **Pedestrian Respect**: Allow pedestrians to cross and avoid splashing water on them.
- 45. **Respecting Other Drivers**: Use courtesy by yielding when necessary and avoiding road rage.

- 46. **Driver Gratitude**: Raise your hand to thank other drivers when they let you into a lane.
- 47. **Safe Driving Mindset**: Stay alert, follow road signs, and always drive with respect for others on the road.
- 48. **Review of Common Driving Offenses**: Driving without a valid license, running red lights, not wearing a helmet, and using mobile phones are common offenses leading to fines and tickets.
- 49. **Driving License and Registration**: Always carry both your valid license and car registration in the vehicle.
- 50. **Green Traffic Light**: When stopped at an intersection and the light turns green, ensure the area is clear before moving.
- 51. **Parking Distance**: Ensure you are parking at the correct distance from intersections, fire hydrants, and traffic lights.
- 52. **Accident Causes**: Most accidents are caused by drivers themselves, often due to poor vehicle condition or driver behavior.
- 53. **Motorcycle Safety Measures**: Always take extra care when riding a motorcycle, especially in traffic.
- 54. **Driving Etiquette**: Avoid actions like using high beams unnecessarily, tailgating, or using a mobile phone while driving.
